THE LIB DEMS ARE STRONGER THAN EVER


As well as Tammy being elected, there were phenomenal results for the Lib Dems, particularly across the Westcountry.

Cllr Tammy Palmer commented that this decision undermines the case made about 'community balance' in our our area.

Local Lib Dems pressure Stagecoach for better bus changes

Thank you to everyone who has completed our bus survey (available at: digitallibdems.typeform.com/exeterbussurvey). Through this, Will Aczel has written to Stagecoach and Devon County Council detailing key next steps for better services, including route-specific improvements and live times at bus stops. Cllr Tammy Palmer is arranging a meeting with Stagecoach to raise local residents' concerns.

Recent changes by Stagecoach see the new K bus route replace the F and P buses in serving Duryard and Pennsylvania. This smaller route should improve dire reliability. Frequency is every 1hr - better but still not good enough for Duryard and worse for Pennsylvania. Stagecoach have said the more the route is used the more frequent buses will become. This seems unfair considering the P bus' unreliability.

Speaking with residents on their doorsteps and through the survey, we also understand there is clear demand for later bus services and a Sunday service.

We will continue to push for regular meetings with Stagecoach to raise local residents' concerns and ask them to review changes in consultation with bus users.

Labour's new car park plans questioned



The old bus station site could serve so many much needed temporary purposes - including hosting a market or performance venue.

But Labour are taking steps to make it a car park, despite

the impending climate crisis and 6 others within 500m that have more than enough spare capacity.

The news comes as Exeter City Council sets out plans to hike already high parking charges across the city.

Car parks are one of ECC's few revenue raising powers. Make no mistake, this is a desperate cash grab attempt by Labour following their wasted millions and the new Labour government's refusal to fix funding for councils.

This is not only unimaginative: this is Labour yet again putting their financial woes ahead of the needs of our city.

Labour set to let pensioners go cold this Winter



Liberal Democrat Cllr Michael Mitchell has proposed a motion to Exeter City Council to address pensioner fuel poverty.

This follows the recent decision by the Labour Government to end universal winter fuel payments and restrict eligibility.

Cllr Michael Mitchell said: "It is important to protect older people, who are particularly vulnerable to the cold.

"18,144 Exeter pensioners are set to lose out

under the new rules, on incomes from just £11,500 - well below the level of the 'living wage'.

"The new Labour government intends to tie Winter Fuel Payments to Pension Credit. But over a third of eligible pensioners don't claim this and it risks cliff-edge support.

"In light of the Energy Price Cap rising by 10% as well, we are campaigning to raise the eligibility level to take pensioners out of fuel poverty."
